





## REFLECTIONS ON THE PRESERVATION OF HISTORY AND HISTORICAL ARTEFACTS IN THE KAROONDA AREA

Reading in the Karoonda and District Historical Society minutes (which are included in the Council meeting agendas on the website) that they are considering how to celebrate their 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary led me to reflect on what was being done about the preservation of history before and after the April 1, 1982, meeting at which the Historical Society was formed.

The story starts in 1977. I had already written a centenary history of Curramulka (on Yorke Peninsula) and was then researching for a centenary history of four Hundreds in the District Council of Snowtown. I had become very strongly aware how much I was using word-of-mouth information gained by interviewing older residents and ex-residents, information not previously documented in any permanent form. By centenary time, the historian is dependent for detail about the pioneering days on what elderly people remembered of what their grandparents had told them decades ago.

Some parts of South Australia – like the Murray Mallee – were not opened up for grain-growing until after 1900 (a whole generation after Curramulka and Snowtown, which had both been settled in the 1870s). If these areas could start interviewing their elderly residents now – instead of waiting until they wanted a centenary book – they could capture so much more detail of the early days before it was taken to the grave.

In May 1977 I wrote letters to District Clerks in the Mallee region. The letters pointed out that *much valuable information* has not been written down in any form and is lost with the death of pioneer citizens and concluded by asking whether any history books had already been published or whether any research was under way and, if not, urging that interviewing be done as soon as practicable.

As a result of this I was invited to address the District Council of Karoonda at its meeting on February 12, 1979 (one of the last meetings prior to amalgamation with East Murray). At one of its first meetings the newly-amalgamated Council decided to produce a book covering the history of both former Council areas. Cr. McKenzie Wall, a farmer at Marama, was appointed convenor. I addressed a public meeting at Karoonda on June 22, 1979, at which a committee, to be chaired by Cr. Wall, was elected. Under my guidance, members of this committee and other interested people began gathering information — interviewing elderly residents, reading records of local organisations, etc. Several former residents living in Adelaide read and noted 1910-1925 era newspapers in the State Library.

By September 1981 I had been with my then-employer long enough to qualify for long-service-leave, opening the opportunity for travel to England and Europe. I flew out of Adelaide on February 25, 1982, and returned on May 23rd.

Some weeks later I visited Karoonda and discovered that during my absence the Karoonda and District Historical Society had been formed.

I was not previously aware that Don Anderson, a retired farmer from Kulkawurra, was as concerned about the loss of historical artefacts as I was about the loss of historical information. Don Anderson's vision was an outdoor museum where tractors, farming plant, tools, etc., and buildings from pioneering days could be preserved. This was also the era the Railways were closing many of the smaller sidings, opening the possibility of obtaining platforms and sheds and even rolling stock for a museum.

Don Anderson took his vision to the local Lions Club, of which he was a member. The Club supported the idea and organised the public meeting on April 1, 1982, at which the Historical Society was formed.

For the next few years, the two historical groups worked in parallel but separately (although some people were involved in both). The Historical Society developed Pioneer Park and I began more intensive research and began writing the first drafts of what became *Karoonda East Murray: A History to 1986.* The committee elected in 1979 became less and less a "committee" and more a support group for me, organising visits to various parts of the district and arranging guides/contacts, etc. There were less and less meetings as such, and minutes were no longer kept. When Cr. Wall sold his farm and left the district in 1980 Bob Barr became chairman.

Karoonda East Murray: A History to 1986 was launched on September 21, 1986, the same day as Pioneer Park was formally opened. The 1979 committee, by then known as the History Gathering Group, disbanded, its task completed. The Historical Society continued, and Pioneer Park continues to evolve.


