Local Stories- Beryl Clothier



A chat about life and hobbies
With Rebekah Crisp

Beryl Clothier has lived in the Mallee all of her 90 years.

The second daughter of Doris and Frank Tee, her family live in a settlement in Victoria called Berrook, east of Peebinga where they came to shop and get their mail.

This was the horse and sulky days, so when her children were born, Doris caught the train down the Peebinga line, through Karoonda (the station had refreshment rooms those days) to Aldgate where her younger sister would meet her. All of the Tee children were born at Stirling district hospital.

When Beryl was three and a half years old they moved to a farm about 6 miles south of Peake on the Pinnaroo line. She and her sister did correspondence lessons with their mother for two years, until the family bought a farm closer to Peake and they could walk to school. Beryl received her progress certificate at the end of grade 7 and worked a year as monitor teacher with Patricia Hicks as there were over 40 students at the school at that time. She has done many jobs since then, including rabbit trapping and bag sewing.

Beryl married Ian Clothier on October 6, 1956. Ian had moved to the Mallee from Crystal Brook, and bought a regrowth Mallee block near Marama. The couple called the block "Berilean Downs" and although there was no power, and no phone, Beryl says they led a hard but happy life at work. In early 1966 they built a new home, with power arriving in October, although the phone line from Marama wouldn't arrive until October 1973. Until then their nearest phone was at the Marama store and post office.

Beryl and Ian had two sons- Christopher Ian born May 1965, and Brenton James born April 1969. Both attended Geranium Area School.

In April 1963 Beryl and her friend Jill McNeil took turns driving to Geranium to attend cake decorating classes, attending for 15 months. Beryl entered a Christmas cake in the Methodist Church strawberry fete at Parrakie in November 1967 and won the champion cake trophy. A friend from Lameroo encouraged her to enter the novice section of the Royal Adelaide show in 1970. It had three sections and she won three first prizes!

She said that she then got keen and entered from 1971 to 1976 in the decorated cake section, and won 139 prizes. She was asked by the show society to be a steward in the junior and open cookery, then to be a judge of the junior and senior decorated cakes, which she did each year from 1982 to 1990.

One of her other hobbies is pyrography (wood burning). She has created trophies for the Karoonda Farm Fair from 1987 to 1995, and submitting an entry in the Royal Adelaide show in 1994 she won 4th prize, then in 2000 received second prize. She has given displays of cake decorating and wood turning at field days at Renmark, Karoonda and Lucindale.

You may recognise some of her work throughout the town of Karoonda, having been part of the creation of the mural of the region, displayed on the public toilet block, and also as the winner of the Mallee Health service logo competition, her design is still in use at Lameroo, Pinnaroo and Karoonda hospitals.

Beryl is also involved in the Women in Agriculture and Business group (WAB), having been a member of the Yurgo branch for more than 50 years, and the secretary for 26 years. She put her wood burning skills to good use, creating plaques for the WAB state conference guest speakers in 1989 and WAB One hundredth birthday cake at Riverton.

WAB are the second oldest women's organisation in Australia, and the Yurgo branch celebrated their 90th birthday in March 2022. The group is now held in Karoonda, but retains the name of Yurgo WAB.

When lan's health deteriorated they bought a house in Karoonda late in 1996. Beryl participated in the Australian plants group, and Karoonda development group.

After lan passed away in March 2001 Beryl joined Murray Bridge wood group for several years and used lan's lathe to turn bowls and plates that she would then wood burn.

Beryl has been a member of the Lameroo craft shop for 31 years and was one of those who started it. She is also a member of Karoonda Red Cross.

Marama Hall Reopens

The hall committee received funding from FRRR to undertake the works during 2022, which included underpinning and painting.

Recently she has given up that position to spend more time at home and let someone else take on the role. She is still a member of the Auxiliary, and will help out when she can.

As well as keeping the books up to date, she organised the banking and investments of the Auxiliary funds. Joyce donated her time and skills in many ways, organising catering for functions, football carnivals and finals, Mindarie / Halidon races, Melbourne cup luncheons, Farm Fair stalls, sheep sales, the Annual Hospital golf/bowls days, and the basketball canteen back in the days we had enough teams playing over two nights. Joyce was the coordinator that made it all happen so that there was a canteen with food and drinks available.

In 1991 she helped to maintain the plants in the Hospital Pergola, and looked after the grounds roses, keeping them pruned and deheaded.

Joyce organised and sold many raffle tickets in the Main Street, sitting under the verandah outside the Café`. She chose gifts for the residents in the Hospital/ Kadistra each year.

Joyce, this is your time to sit back and watch others take over the reins. We all thank you for all your years of volunteering in these positions, BUT don't go anywhere, we still need your knowledge and organizational skills.



Be on the Lookout: Land Managers urged to Report Invasive Summer Grasses

The Murraylands and Riverland Landscape Board is urging local landholders to be on the lookout for invasive summer grasses after the unseasonably wet spring conditions.

As the weather starts to warm up, buffel grass, African lovegrass, coolatai grass and fountain grass will likely flourish across many parts of the region. In addition, dormant weed seeds may well be exposed and moved by rainfall and flood events, potentially spreading weed incursions to new areas.

While invasive summer grasses were originally introduced to Australia as pasture species, many have poor nutritional value and outcompete native vegetation and productive pastures. Ecosystems that include invasive summer grasses often have significantly higher fuel loads than native grasses, increasing the risk and severity of bush fires.

District officer Jamie Courtney said that this year's cool and wet seasonal conditions are ideal for invasive summer weed species to flourish.

"Some summer grass species can be hard to spot at the best of times, but the cool, wet winter has boosted winter vegetation which can hide emerging summer weeds".

Mr Courtney encouraged landholders to be on the lookout for invasive summer grass incursions on their own properties and on public lands, particularly where soil has recently been disturbed.

"There are a number of roadworks and infrastructure projects in the region at the moment, and the movement of soil and high traffic use risks the movement of seeds and the establishment of weeds. The spread of weeds can also be linked to the movement of tractors, slashers and other agricultural implements, and vehicles that haven't been sufficiently cleaned to remove contaminated debris".

Landholders are encouraged to regularly review sites where summer grasses may emerge, and seek help to identify and control incursions.

"Murraylands and Riverland Landscape Board district officers can help property owners, blockies and farmers to identify summer weeds and relevant control options, and we encourage you to contact your local landscape office as a first port of call".

"Fact sheets for several summer grass species are available on our website, or for comprehensive information about best-practise control options, consult the controlling weeds section of the PIRSA website."



Are Rabbits a problem?

Do you remember seeing any bare patches around paddock edges when your crops were emerging last year? Were there bare patches bordering any scrub? This may have been caused by rabbits!

The wet spring experienced in the region saw rabbit numbers also increase, but after a dryish January now is a good time to do a rabbit control program, and get on top of those pesky creatures. Control activities work even better if you get your neighbours in on the act, and a group of you do it at the same time. The results will be better and there will be less opportunity for rabbits to re-invade your property from neighbouring land.

1080 poison treated oats (and free feed oats if required) can be purchased from the Murraylands and Riverland Landscape Board or staff can treat your clean oats. Landholders requiring poisoned oats must contact a District Officer to arrange a suitable time for mixing or bait collection. Please do not bring dogs or young children to the collection points.

Three trails of untreated oats must be laid prior to laying the poison trail. Baitlayers are available for hire to landowners for rabbit control programs.

Research shows that warren destruction is a very important part of long term rabbit control. A well mapped plan to remove all warrens from an area is a feasible, long-term management option after baiting. Destroying warrens when the rabbit population is very low substantially decreases the likelihood of reinvasion. A coordinated warren destruction program carried out with your neighbours is a great investment towards maintaining a rabbit free property. The cost of warren destruction will be offset by substantially reduced maintenance costs over time.






A number of projects have been completed by a small group of hard working volunteers, many of whom are over 70 years of age.
