Members have been very busy giving some of the old corrugated iron buildings a facelift. The Mindarie pump shed and Yurgo siding good's shed have been

repainted.




The 'Takeout' Shed and adjacent platform are originals from the Yurgo Railway Station situated on the Peebinga line 20 kilometres from Karoonda. It opened on 28 December 1914 and closed on 1 November 1979. The shed and platform were relocated in to Pioneer Park in 1985. A maintenance fettler gang was based in Yurgo and three cottages and a barrack.





The farmers left their cream and eggs in the shed, and filled out a consignment form which was placed in a special box. The

goods were collected by the train and taken to Adelaide. Because it was a single track the trains would come up one day and back





The repairs to and painting of Hood's house is the next project to be tackled by a



painter. The park and other attractions in the town have been attracting some interest from travel groups and Michael Mills from Illuminart and Jarrod Pickford, the podcast producer of Storytowns. We are attempting to improve the appearance of the park to make it more appealing to community groups by greening up the area between the carriages and machinery shed.

Meetings are held on the fourth Tuesday of the month in the shed at Pioneer Park. Watch the Facebook page and notice-boards for upcoming working bees.

Japanese encephalitis

Japanese encephalitis (JE) is a disease that can infect pigs, waterbirds and horses. JE is exotic to Australia but has recently been detected in pigs in southeast Australia, including South Australia.

About the virus

JEV is an arbovirus which means it is transmitted via bites from infected mosquitoes. La Niña weather conditions have made the weather wetter and warmer than normal, increasing mosquito activity.

Mosquito bites spread the virus

Mosquitoes become infected with the virus after feeding off an infected animal. Once infected, mosquitoes can spread the virus over long distances.

People can also become infected through mosquito bites. The virus does not spread from animals to animals, and it does not spread from animals to humans.

There is no evidence of human-to-human transmission of the virus.

Symptoms to look for in pigs

Common symptoms in pigs include:

- mummified, stillborn, abnormal, or weak piglets
- neurological signs in piglets including paddling, tremors or convulsions
- · depression, wasting or hindlimb paralysis may be seen in sucklings and weaners
- boars may experience infertility, fluid retention (oedematous) and congested testicles.

Adult female pigs do not typically show other signs of disease.

How you can minimise the risk to your pigs

Control mosquitoes on your property

- eliminate mosquito breeding areas (e.g. stagnant water)
- pig producers should contact Australian Pork Limited (APL) for specific advice about using chemicals for mosquito control

Government of South Australia
Department of Primary Industries and Regions

Minimise pig exposure to mosquitos

- use mosquito repellent or netting
- cover animals or keep them indoors at a time of high mosquito activity (dawn, and dusk and overnight).

Treating the virus

There is currently no effective vaccine or treatment for animals. Effective management of mosquitoes on your property is key to preventing the spread of infection.

Reporting an animal suspected with the virus

Japanese encephalitis is an exotic a notifiable exotic disease in South Australia.

If you suspect Japanese encephalitis in pigs within South Australia, report it immediately on the Emergency Animal Disease Watch Hotline on 1800 675 888.



Japanese encephalitis – information for horse owners

Japanese encephalitis (JE) is a disease that can infect pigs, waterbirds and horses. JE is exotic to Australia but has recently been detected in pigs in southeast Australia, including South Australia.

About the virus

JEV is an arbovirus which means it is transmitted via bites from infected mosquitoes. La Niña weather conditions have made the weather wetter and warmer than normal, increasing mosquito activity.

Mosquito bites spread the virus

Mosquitoes become infected with the virus after feeding off an infected animal. Once infected, mosquitoes can spread the virus over long distances.

People can also become infected through mosquito bites. The virus does not spread from animals to animals, and it does not spread from animals to humans.

There is no evidence of human-to-human transmission of the virus.

Symptoms to look for in horses

Many horses infected with the virus are asymptomatic. Most cases showing symptoms are mild, however severe encephalitis can cause death.

Common symptoms in horses and donkeys include:

- elevated temperature
- lethargy
- decreased or no appetite
- jaundice
- neurological such as incoordination, wobbliness, hyperexcitability
- difficulty swallowing or impaired vision.

Most horses will recover within a week of having this disease.

Other arboviruses may also show the same clinical signs. These include West Nile virus – Kunjin strain (WNV-Kunjin), Murray Valley encephalitis virus (MVEV) and Ross River virus (RRV) which are endemic to Australia.

How you can minimise the risk to your horses

Minimise horse exposure to mosquitos

- use mosquito repellent or netting
- put a light summer or cotton rug on horses, a fly mask, and if the horse allows, apply a safe insect repellent. Do not spray repellent around or above their eyes
- rugging and hooding with lightweight permethrin fabric may help protect horses not stabled overnight
- · eliminate mosquito breeding sites by limiting the amount of stagnant water around horses
- house horses during peak periods of mosquito activity (between dusk and dawn).

Treating the virus

There is no effective treatment for JE in horses or other livestock.



If you suspect JE (or other arboviruses) in your horses, especially if showing clinical signs, please call the Emergency Animal Disease Watch Hotline on 1800 675 888.

Arboviral diseases in humans

Arboviral diseases may also affect humans, with RRV and Barmah Forest virus being the most common arbovirus diseases in SA. Most JE infections in people cause no symptoms. Some infected people experience an illness with fever and headache but severe illness may cause fever, convulsions disorientation and coma. If you experience symptoms, you should seek medical advice and contact SA Health.


Over 20 years or so he has donated over \$30,000 to community groups and organisations.

"training nights are fun! We learn or reeducate our skills but always manage to have a few laughs as well. We have a great supportive and caring team".




