All farm chemical users within the Karoonda East Murray region are encouraged to bring their empty, properly cleaned, non-returnable, steel and plastic farm chemical containers to the Council Depot for inspection and collection.

Remember all drums must be correctly cleaned both inside and out (including caps and threads) and allowed to air dry to ensure they contain no rinse water in line with the "Agsafe Standard for Effective Rinsing of Farm Chemical Containers" (brochure available from chemical retail outlets).

Unclean or partly filled containers will not be accepted and will remain the property of the chemical user.

Council looks forward to your support in rinsing out, rounding up, and running in all your empty, properly cleaned, non-returnable farm chemical containers.

The Murraylands and Riverland Landscape Board is urging landholders to control African boxthorn infestations on their properties and roadsides.

offering bed and breakfast

Another prickly invader

Murraylands and Riverland Landscape Board, Murraylands District Manager Kylie Moritz said unchecked infestations could invade cropping areas and bushland, provide shelter for foxes and rabbits and a home for fruit fly.

"A coordinated effort last year controlled African boxthorns from more than 800 kilometres of roadsides and 100 kilometres of railway tracks throughout the region. We now need to follow up and control any new plants or re-growth," she said.

"Many plants will be looking green and healthy, which is the perfect opportunity for control while the plant is actively growing.

"Herbicide application by foliar spray, or to the freshly cut stump or mechanical removal of the plant with machinery are all successful control techniques.

"African boxthorn is considered a secondary fruit fly host. The small red berries it produces are a welcome home for the devastating invasive fly.

"While African boxthorn may not be the first choice of fruit, it can provide a refuge for fruit fly and aid them in persisting long enough in our landscape to invade other fruit crops.

"Landholders can do their part in the fruit fly fight for our region by controlling any African boxthorn plants they find on their property or roadsides."

Ms Moritz said district officers were keen to work with landowners to develop a plan to manage boxthorn on their property.

"We encourage landholders with boxthorn problems to give us a call and discuss the issue so we can provide advice and expertise to help them get on top of the problem," she said.

African boxthorn is a declared pest plant, and landowners are required to take reasonable control measures on their properties and adjoining roadsides under the statutory obligations of the *Landscape South Australia Act 2019* (the Act).






